

JOHN the baptist

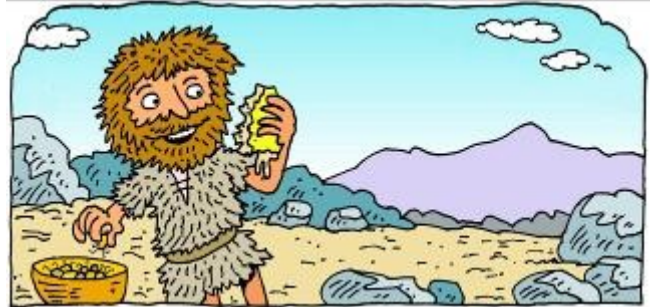
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John the Baptist told everyone to do what was good and right and to get baptised to show they were going to live for God.
